**DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:** This position is located in the Office of the Chief Financial Officer, Government Operation Cluster, Department of Employment Services (DOES). This position is responsible for monitoring and overseeing the design and development of the financial components to assure conformance to District and Federal requirements; advises and assists the Agency Fiscal Officer (AFO) in the formulation, prescription, and promulgation of Department-wide financial management policies, standards, guidelines, controls, and procedures; manages departmental programs related to financial reporting to include forecasting, federal reporting, independent and operational audits; represents the AFO and other management at meetings and conferences; provides final policy review of the Department's annual report and annual financial statements; coordinates and reviews all financial reports of grant and entitlement programs prior to submission to the grantor agency; provides leadership and guidance to the professional staff of the Accounting department as they develop departmental policy related to the ledger structure; operates a quality control program; resolves complex audit adjustment issues; interpret reports, statements, and financial data; develops and maintain detailed accounting and financial records; conducts special studies on matters which require immediate resolution; ensures that all accounts properly reviewed and reconciled on a monthly basis. Performs other duties as assigned.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIREMENTS:** One (1) year of Specialized Experience performing the related duties and responsibilities is required. **In addition** – Applicant must have a degree in accounting **or** related field such as business administration, finance, **or** public administration that included **or** was supplemented by 24 semester hours in accounting. The 24 hours may include up to 6 hours of credit in business law. The applicant's background must also include one of the following: (1) Twenty-four semester hours in accounting **or** auditing courses of appropriate type and quality. This can include up to 6 hours of business law. (2) A certificate as Certified Public Accountant **or** a Certified Internal Auditor, obtained through written examination; **or** (3) Completion of the requirements for a degree that included substantial course work in accounting or auditing. **Applicants must submit an official transcript that verifies a degree in accounting with 24 semester credit hours in accounting in order to be considered. If applicable, your application package must include an English translation of all foreign transcripts In addition foreign transcripts should be translates through an education services.**

**SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE:** Experience that has provided the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level in the normal line of progression for the occupation in the organization.

**SELECTIVE PLACEMENT FACTOR(S):** Applicant must have a degree in accounting or a degree in a related field such as business administration, finance, or public administration that included or was supplemented by 24 semester hours in accounting. The 24 hours may include up to 6 hours of credit in business law.
