SUBJECT: Summary of FY 2022 Reprogramming Requests (Operating and Capital) – July 1, 2022, through September 30, 2022

Dear Mayor Bowser and Chairman Mendelson:

Section 2 of the District Anti-Deficiency Act of 2002, effective April 4, 2003 (D.C. Law 14-285; D.C. Official Code §47-355 et seq.), as amended by the Fiscal Year 2011 Supplemental Budget Support Act of 2010, effective April 8, 2011 (D.C. Law 18-370; D.C. Official Code §47-355.05(e)), requires that the Chief Financial Officer transmit to the Mayor and Council a quarterly summary of reprogrammings.

In accordance with this provision, I am transmitting a summary report of Local, Capital, Special Purpose Revenue, and American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) reprogramming requests approved during the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2022. The first five sections of this report include reprogrammings that were below the \$500,000 threshold or otherwise did not require Council approval, and the remaining sections include reprogrammings that were transmitted to Council. The report shows requests by fund type and the amount of funds reprogrammed, and it provides a brief justification for each request. All sections are separated out and subtotaled by funding source.
